

THE FUMC THRIFT STORE

The "birth" of the Myrtle Beach First United Methodist Church Clothes Ministry began October 4, 2004 as a resource for providing free clothing to the homeless and needy in the community. The founding members were Jean Clemmons, Imogene Booth, Mary Lee Jones, Gresta Newton, Martha Peterson and Donna Marzolf. Soon after the Clothes Closet was in operation, it was decided that men were needed. Harold Clemmons and Ashley Booth were recruited. It was noted that more help was needed and volunteers from the congregation stepped up to the plate; some having now served over a span of several years.

In 2012, the volunteers were introduced to Bob Lupton's book **Toxic Charity – How Churches and Charities Hurt Those They Help**. The book reinforced thoughts that it was time to make some changes in the way the store operated to best help the needy in our community. He states that an unhealthy pattern of giving without proper accountabilities results in:

Give once and you elicit <u>appreciation</u>
Give twice and you create <u>anticipation</u>
Give three times and you create <u>expectation</u>
Give four times and it becomes <u>entitlement</u>
Give five times and you establish dependency

This pattern describes what the clothes closet had become—we had established dependency and we were enablers for many who had been users of the system for years. The consensus of the group was that the "free giving" was hurting the people that the mission set out to help and encouraging ever-growing handout lines diminishing the dignity of the poor.

As a result of the evaluation, the clothes closet closed in September 2012, in order to revamp and then reopened November 5, 2012 as the FUMC Thrift Store. The new mission statement read as follows:

The FUMC Thrift Store is an outreach ministry of First United Methodist Church committed to helping make a difference in the lives of families and individuals in need within our community by providing high quality, new and gently used clothing, shoes and house-wares at extremely low prices.

The new mission served as a means to uphold and affirm the poor's dignity—reaching out to those people who were really struggling and needed help—but who were reluctant to accept charity.

The proceeds received from sales have helped thousands of people over the years. One hundred thousand plus dollars (\$100,000+) have been distributed to various needs within our community and beyond. It is with heavy hearts that after nineteen (19) years the time has come for this outreach ministry to end.

The building contents must be removed by July 1, 2023 for pending planned demolition. A suitable site on campus is not available at this time to continue operation. The Thrift Store will close its doors June 24, 2023.

Thanks to all who have been so supportive in making this such a successful ministry and to the dedicated volunteers who are so heartbroken having put their hearts and souls into this ministry for so many years.
